Senior Pastor, Clear Lake Baptist Church (2008-present)

Clear Lake Baptist Church serves the NASA aerospace community near Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas. The church recorded an increase of new members from 8 in 2007 to an average increase of 35 annually. The Clear Lake Food Pantry (a ministry of CLBC) serves 13,000 families annually. The church established a Spanish language congregation in 2009, currently averaging 75 in attendance.

Senior Pastor, First Baptist Church, Devine, Texas (2001-2008)

First Baptist Church of Devine led the Frio River Baptist Association in baptisms, additions by letter, and missions giving for five consecutive years, averaging over 60 decisions per year, half by baptism. Worship attendance increased 77%. Sunday School attendance increased by 42%, and offerings by 64%. An additional morning service was added to the church schedule and more property annexed to the church campus. The Cowboy Church of Medina County was established as a mission, and averaged 130 in attendance by the end of its first year. "Mission Devine" was founded. This is an interdenominational community-wide ministry which helps elderly and indigent homeowners with renovations and repairs. Since its inception, over 240 homes have been served by this ministry in a town of less than 4,000 people.

Senior Pastor, First Baptist Church of Youngsville, Louisiana (1994-2001)

During my tenure the church transitioned from mission to church status. Worship and Sunday School attendance doubled and receipts increased by 64%. The church averaged 40 additions per year, half by baptism. A major building project added education, fellowship, and office space to the church's campus.

Youth Minister, First Baptist Church of Devine, Texas (1990-1994)

Youth Minister, North Side Baptist Church of Lafayette, Louisiana (1987-1989)

Commissioner, Medina County Emergency Services District #4, (2007)

This is a court-appointed five member board responsible for the oversight and administration of the local EMS. Responsibilities included setting the local tax rate and

administering funds to provide emergency services for two incorporated cities and the surrounding rural area.

Board of Directors, C.O.S.E.C.H.A Ministries (2002-present)

This ministry supports a Bible Institute training pastors and lay workers from various Totonac Indian villages in Southern Mexico. There are currently about thirty Mexican churches, and one full time missionary affiliated with C.O.S.E.C.H.A.

Vice President, Board of Directors, Bay Area Charter Schools (2008-present)

This is a system of three publicly funded charter schools that serve 1st – 12th grade at risk students in the Houston area through project-based educational methods.
